In this context, tolerance is considered a practice that individuals, groups, and nations must uphold. Meanwhile, it does not imply equality, compromise, or leniency. Instead, it primarily involves taking a positive stance, affirming the rights of others to enjoy universally recognized human rights and freedoms. It is linked to responsibility, which forms the cornerstone of human rights and pluralism, including cultural diversity,



democracy, and the rule of law. These concepts affirm that tolerance implies that diverse humans in their characteristics, situations, languages, conduct, and values have the right to coexist peacefully, allowing their looks to agree with their true identity. Furthermore, it signifies that one's opinions should not be imposed on others.
